





George Washington Memorial Parkway

The National Capital Region Network Inventory & Monitoring (NCRN I&M) program monitors forest breeding birds in George Washington Memorial Parkway at 20 points (see map below). **Right:** Yearly abundance estimates (2007-2011) for four of the most abundant species in the NCRN that occur in George Washington Memorial Parkway, and 13 species of conservation concern detected within George Washington Memorial Parkway. Highest and lowest mean values are labeled and vertical lines indicate standard errors. Three of the 4 regionally abundant species remained stable, while Red-eyed Vireo abundance has increased. Most of the species of conservation concern had stable abundances. However, Eastern Wood-Pewee abundance has increased within the park. **Left:** Average Bird Community Index scores for George Washington Memorial Parkway (2007-2011).




Average Bird Community Index (BCI) Scores
BCI scores (mean ± SE) for George Washington Memorial Parkway (2007-2011) based on forest breeding bird surveys and assessment of bird communities. Ranges of scores indicate relative levels of low, medium, high, and highest habitat integrity, indicated by red, orange, yellow, and green colors, respectively.
